- The town of Murray was incorporated in the year 1844, named after the United States representative from Kentucky, John L, Murray.
- In the year 1902 the "radio" was discovered by Nathan B. Stubblefield and presented in a public demonstration on the courthouse lawn.
- In 2012 Rand McNally and USA Today named Murray the *Friendliest Small Town in America*. Murray has been recognized nationally and has won numerous awards including "Playful City USA" for the last four years.

Murray has also been recognized nationally as being in the "Top 100 best communities for young people" for four years in a row.

- In 2018, Murray Main Street was awarded by the Kentucky Heritage Council the following honors: Best media promotion award, and Best Main Street Youth Event Honors.
- W. Earl Brown, born in 1963 and native of Murray, is a well-known actor, screenwriter, producer and musician starring in "Scream (1996), Chicago Fire, American Horror Story, The Mandalorian" among many other movies, productions and TV shows.
- In 2022, Murray State University was awarded "Top 25 Regional Universities," and ranked 11th in "Top Public Regional University." In addition, Washington Monthly recognized Murray State University for "Getting the best bang for the buck" as one of the most affordable schools.

Where to spend the day in Downtown Murray

Despite Murray's small size it is full of fun events, great businesses and delicious cuisine from many different restaurants. Many of the best places to visit in Murray are hidden gems. Murray is home to Murray State University which brings in many out of state and international students every year. Land between the Lakes: Elk and Bison Prairie

Thirty minutes away from the small town of Murray Kentucky sits a beautiful natural preservation sanctuary known as *Land Between the Lakes*. From bike trails to a planetarium, Land Between the Lakes simply has it all. One conservation project amongst the rest quite often does not get the recognition it so deserves. The Elk and Bison Prairie is a 700-acre enclosure home to not only the obvious 'Elk and Bison' but a wide variety of small game including wild turkey, prairie animals and many species of birds. The Elk and Bison Prairie is open dawn to dusk and has a \$5 fee to open the entryway gates. It's a serene place where you can watch Bison and Elk grazing, walking, and enjoying life in the fields. There is a 3.5 mile driving loop taking visitors on a very scenic drive through the forests, past the watering holes, going over the creek. The elk and bison prairie is a truly beautiful area of land having been cultivated by these animals. Spring through summer is a great time of the year to get out and see these fascinating animals, the Bison can always be found enjoying the weather during warmer spring months.

Murray State Legend: Johnny Reagan

The Murray State baseball team has had a great year following the 33-25 record in 2021. The field they practice, and play on is aptly named after one of the greatest baseball players Murray State has ever seen, Johnny Reagan. Reagan was an athlete from 1944-48 and quickly got himself into the Racer Hall of Fame with his amazing prowess as an athlete. However, his legacy truly lies in his 36years as a baseball coach at Murray State, in his time he led the team to win 11 Ohio Valley Conference Championships. Reagan became a 10-time OVC coach of the year and Murray State has continued to honor him by naming the very field he played, coached and won on after him.

Downtown Farmers Market: Stimulating the Local Economy

Murray's Downtown Farmers Market began in 1998, starting with only a few vendors each week. It has continued to grow in size and participation not only from vendors but customers as well. Today the Downtown Farmers Market, which is hosted by Murray Main Street, boasts more than fifty vendors in peak season from June to July. The market is open every Saturday 7a.m. to noon, May through October and is located on 5th and Maple Street. Many farmers benefit directly from coming to the Farmers Market and often sell out of their goods. It is a program helping to support local farms and artisans in the area. The market draws a substantial crowd each Saturday and is a fun way to shop locally for fresh produce, soaps, baked goods, and so much more. It is a great way to become immersed in the Murray community.
